Actual Measurements Approx 85 cm, 33½ in, deep by approx 201 cm, 79 in, across upper edge.

4 x 100g balls of Paintbox Yarns Simply DK in Vintage Pink (As seen on cover)
3¾mm (UK 9 - US 5) circular needle
4mm (UK 8 - US 6) circular needle
Pair of 4mm (UK 8 - US 6) knitting needles

22 stitches and 30 rows to 10 cm (4 in) measured over ridge pattern using 4mm (UK 8 - US 6) needles, or size required to give correct tension.

It is vitally important to check your tension (*gauge*) before starting as working to the wrong tension (*gauge*) will mean your item will not be the size shown and could result in yarn being left over, or more yarn being required. Before beginning, knit a tension (*gauge*) swatch at least 12 cm, 5 in, square and measure your tension (*gauge*). If there are more sts and rows than stated, try again using thicker needles. If there are fewer sts and rows than stated, try again using thinner needles.

Paintbox Yarns cannot accept responsibility for the finished item if any yarn other than the recommended yarn is used. Yarn quantities are based on average requirements and are therefore approximate.

Colour reproduction is as close as printing processes will allow. Instructions are written using UK terminology with changes for US terminology given in italics in round brackets () afterwards.

Repeat figures in round brackets () the number of times stated afterwards.

cm = centimetres; **cont** = continue; **dec 2** = decrease 2 sts as follows: slip next 2 sts as though to K2tog, K1, then pass the 2 slipped sts over this K st; **in** = inches; **K** = knit; **P** = purl; **patt** = pattern; **pssso** = pass slipped stitch over; **rep** = repeat; **rs** = right side; **sl 1** = slip one stitch; **st(s)** = stitch(es); **tbl** = through back of loops; **tog** = together; **ws** = wrong side.

LEAVE

Cast on 525 sts using 3¼mm (UK 9 - US 5) circular needle.
Working backwards and forwards in rows, not rounds, cont as follows:

row 1 (rs) K1, *P1, K1, rep from * to end.

row 2 K2, *P1, K1, rep from * to last st, K1.

These 2 rows form rib.

Place a marker on centre st of last row – there should be 262 sts either side of marked st.

row 3 K1, K2tog, rib to within 1 st of marked st, dec 2 (marked st is centre st of this group of 3 sts), rib to last 3 sts, sl 1, K1, pssso, K1. 521 sts.

row 4 K1, P1, rib to marked st, P marked st, rib to last 2 sts, P1, K1.

row 5 K1, sl 1, K1, pssso, rib to within 1 st of marked st, dec 2, rib to last 3 sts, K2tog, K1. 517 sts.

row 6 K1, P2tog, rib to marked st, P marked st, rib to last 3 sts, P2tog tbl, K1. 515 sts.

row 7 as row 5. 511 sts.

row 8 K2, rib to marked st, P marked st, rib to last 2 sts, K2.

rows 9 and 10 as rows 5 and 6. 505 sts.

Change to 4mm (UK 8 - US 6) circular needle.

Still shaping Shawl, now work in ridge patt as follows:

row 1 (rs) K1, sl 1, K1, pssso, K to within 1 st of marked st, dec 2, K to last 3 sts, K2tog, K1.

row 2 K1, P to marked st, P marked st, P to last st, K1.

row 3 K1, sl 1, K1, pssso, K to within 1 st of marked st, dec 2, K to last 3 sts, K2tog, K1.

row 4 K1, P2tog, P to marked st, P marked st, P to last 3 sts, P2tog tbl, K1.

rows 5 to 8 as rows 1 to 4.

rows 9 to 11 as rows 1 to 3.

row 12 K1, P2tog, knit to marked st, P marked st, knit to last 3 sts, P2tog tbl, K1. 475 sts.

These 12 rows form ridge patt and cont to shape Shawl.

Changing to 4mm (UK 8 - US 6) straight needles when number of sts has decreased down sufficiently, rep last 12 rows 15 times more. 25 sts.

Work ridge patt and shaping rows 1 to 8 once more. 5 sts.

next row (rs) K1, dec 2, K1. 3 sts.

next row P3tog and fasten off.

MAKING UP

Do NOT steam press!

Pin out Shawl to measurements given, cover with a clean damp cloth and leave to dry naturally.
