# Spring Ahead Beanie



This hat pattern is very easy to manipulate for different weights of yarn and different size heads. The ribbing needs to be a multiple of 2 stitches and the body needs to be a multiple of 7. There is a round of plain knit right after the ribbing for you to make the necessary increases evenly around to reach your multiple of 7.

3 sizes have been included:

Child (approx. 19-20 inch head circumference)

Ladies (approx. 22-23 inch head circumference)

Men's (approx. 24-25 inch head circumference)

They are written in the pattern as follows:

child, (ladies, men's)

## **Materials:**

80g (approx. 200 yds )of DK weight yarn Size 4.0mm (6 US) needles for working in the round

Darning needle

**Gauge:** Stockinette in the round:

6sts and 8 rows in 1 inch

### **Abbreviations:**

CO: cast on

k: knit

p: purl

k1tlb: knit 1 sts through the back loop

k2tog: knit 2 stitches together

st: stitch sts: stitches

increase: kfb, knit front and back

#### Pattern:

Cast on: 104 (112, 118) sts using long tail cast on.

# Ribbing:

Row 1: \*k1tbl, p1\* repeat \*\* to end of round

Repeat row 1 for 1.5 (2.5, 3) inches or until desired length

Child and Men's sizes: Knit around increasing 1 st

Ladies: Knit around

## **Body**

Round 1: \*k6, p1\* repeat \*\* to end of round

Round 2: k3, \*p1, k6\* repeat \*\* to last 4 sts, p1, k3

Repeat rounds 1&2 for approx. 5 (6, 7) inches or until desired length. The crown decreases are quite rapid and will not add much depth to the hat.

# **Crown Decreases:**

Round 1: k1, k2tog, \*p1, k4, k2tog\* repeat \*\* to last 4 sts, p1, k3

Round 2: \*k2tog, k3, p1\* repeat \*\* to end

Round 3: k1, p1, \*k4, p1\*, repeat \*\* to last 3 sts, k3

Round 4: \*k4, p1\* repeat \*\* to end of round

Round 5: \*k1, k2tog, k2tog\*

Round 6: k2tog around (note: for child and men's, repeat to last 3 sts, k3tog)

Round 7: \*k2tog\* to end

Cut a 6 inch tail, thread through remaining stitches on needle and cinch tight!
